Dr. Wilkie will present the challenges facing archaeologists in remote areas of the world, including Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Grevena in Greece. Dr. Wilkie began her career studying classical and Greek prehistory, but soon expanded her interests to include archaeology in southern Asia and the cultural property issues that face today's scholars. Don't miss the chance to hear Dr. Wilkie share her experiences studying and visiting these fascinating regions and topics.
